





Monitoring the success of eradication programmes in inhabited islands in Italy

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Working on inhabited islands honours...

- Opportunity to combine the benefits to the ecosystem with those to resident communities
 - Reduce zoonotic risk
 - Reduce damage to crops
 - Reduce damage to wires and tubes
 - Reduce impacts on commercial activities (restaurants, diving centers)
 - Reduce impact on food stores
 - Reduce the amount of rodenticide spread
- Great consensus among residents and tourists increase the awareness on eradication programmes

honours...

- Great support from residents and tourists increases acceptance of eradication projects
- Important and very effective communications activities









Working on inhabited islands

...and burdens

- great challenges, increased complexity
- presence of non-target animals (including pets)
- highly diversified habitats
- important food sources for rats (garbage dumps, poultry houses, food stores...)







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Ventotene (Ponziane, Latium) 140 ha, 700 residents



Two case study




San Domino (Tremiti, Apulia) 205 ha, 500 residents

Success must be proven above and below ground











Sewer baiting, a first in rat eradication

Main tools

- In the last stages of eradication, rats do not enter the dispensers, and food is abundant (as for an invader on a rat-free islands)
- It is necessary to focus on detection with different tools
- Catching them with traps
- Camera traps are a key tools too
- Experimental use of bat detectors in San Domino





San Domino

No consumption inside bait stations from September 2022 but every month some reports - only 1 in January-February 2023

All reports in areas with extra-food sources (survived or converged there?)



2 rats killed by an A24 in a hen house with no bait consumption from 2 months



Last rat sighting on San Domino: an adult male not in search of food


Can residents help?

- On inhabited islands, the cooperation of residents is extremely important
- On both islands, most of the reports were reliable => discovering of some rats surviving in very small areas
- Presence of unfounded reports



Biosecurity: a help from genetic analyses







Biosecurity activities

- Cooperation with maritime companies
- Awareness-raising of residents for involvement in biosecurity
- Camera trapping
- Wax blox, tracking cards
- Trapping and baiting in:
 - harbours and landing points on target islands
 - ships
 - harbours of mainland
 - harbours of other islands (Ponza)
